

BECOME AN ENERGY CODE AMBASSADOR!

WHAT IS THE ENERGY CODE AMBASSADORS PROGRAM?

The Energy Code Ambassadors Program (ECAP) is a program of the International Code Council (ICC) and the Building Codes Assistance Project (BCAP). ECAP recruits, trains, and positions code officials as Ambassadors in states in coordination with state energy offices and ICC chapters. It empowers existing code professionals by developing their expertise and leadership in building energy efficiency.

Ambassadors provide guidance and peer-to-peer support for the code enforcement community to improve compliance with energy codes.

PARTICIPANTS RECEIVE

- Free training on the residential and commercial energy code; and which supporting resources are available from BCAP, the US Department of Energy and ICC.
- At least one free ICC energy certification test.
- Free online certification exam study course(s).
- Free IECC book and commentary.
- Recognition as a Certified Energy Code Ambassador.
- Support via a network of Energy Code Ambassadors.
- Heightened awareness of your expertise. Other jurisdictions will be made aware of your availability to assist with energy code questions and issues. Ambassadors may be asked to provide guidance on specific issues, testify at code hearings, or visit other jurisdictions to offer guidance on energy code issues.

THE AMBASSADOR NETWORK

The ECAP program exists in Alabama, Idaho, Nevada, Ohio, Oklahoma, Texas, Utah, and Wyoming.

Buildings use 40% of all the energy consumed in the country. Saving energy is an important initiative for the United States, and its citizens. Building energy codes assure that buildings use less energy over the lifetime of the building. But energy codes must be properly implemented and enforced. That is why we need YOUR help to recognize and promote the value of energy efficiency through building energy codes.
