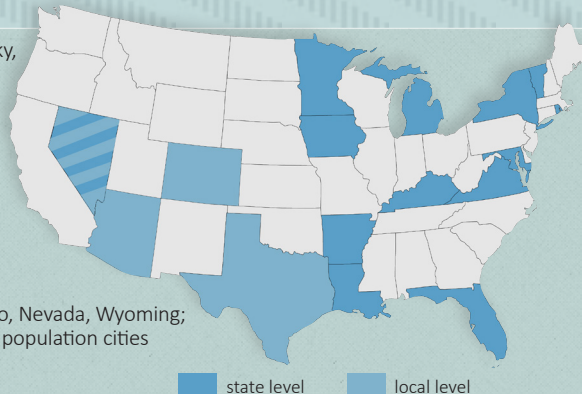
Approval for DOE Energy Codes Conference in Nashville, TN

- **STRETCH/GREEN CODES:** District of Columbia, Rhode Island, Vermont
- **LOCAL ADOPTIONS:** Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, Wyoming; 65 jurisdictions in Texas with 5 million population cities adopted higher-than-state code
